This Art Deco style table impressed the judges with highly complex mechanical functionality and exceptional craftsmanship featuring pau ferro, maple and maple burl, ebony, and various marquetry woods. As announced at IWF Atlanta, Thibodeau is awarded the \$3000 top prize in this design competition recognizing excellence in veneer woodworking, plus \$1000 for early deadline entry. Herzog Veneers is the distributor that supplied the materials and is awarded \$2000, and sales representative Julienne Barata is awarded \$1000 in recognition of participation in the supply chain.

The category winners in this year's competition, each receiving \$1000, are: **Architectural Woodworking**, Bespoke, Larchwood, IA, "Transitional Panelled Office;" **Cabinetry**, Paul Mann Custom Boats, Manns Harbor, NC, "*Caught Up* Interior;" **Furniture**, David Bondy, Rancho Santa Margarita, CA, "Colosseum Coffee Table;" **Marquetry**, Ken Cowell, Yorba Linda, CA, "The Lady;" **Specialty Items**, Rolling Arts Bicycles, Burr Ridge, IL, "Meep-Meep;" and **Student Design**, John Ausel/Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology, Quarryville, PA, "Federal Card Table."

The judges recognized honorable mention for nine entries: **Architectural Woodworking**, Fetzer Architectural Woodwork, Salt Lake City, UT, "United States Courthouse for the District of Utah - Salt Lake City, Utah;" **Furniture**, Michael Noll, Columbus, IN, "Gated Leg Table;" Brian Newell, Fort Bragg, CA, "W;" and Jeffrey Roberts, J S Roberts Furniture Maker, Unity, NH, "Sheraton Sideboard;" **Marquetry**, Joe Morgan, Park Rapids, MN, "End of My Rope;" and Al Spicer, Bessemer City, NC, for "Geometric Table" and "Tilt Top Table;" and **Student Design**, Andrew Lesuer/Red Rocks Community College, Lakewood, CO, "Lucent Shoji Cabinet;" and Mark Welle/Pittsburg State University, Milford, IA, "Executive Ivory."

Experts from the fields of woodworking media, education, and hardwood plywood and veneer distribution composed the panel of judges for the 2016 Veneer Tech Craftsman's Challenge. They are Marc Adams, Marc Adams School of Woodworking; Bill Esler, editorial director for the Woodworking Network; and Bob Nurre, national accounts business manager for Roseburg Forest Products.

"Overall, the winning projects exhibited a greater level of technical proficiency and design excellence," commented Esler. "Two general trends were evident: an adherence to the rigors of timeless design, particularly in furniture and marquetry; and, new this year, projects tested the limits of veneer's potential for fabrication and new applications. With so much great work on display, we judges wrestled with the decisions for category winners."
